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ICYMI: Reps. Buchanan, Panetta re-introduce bipartisan bill to expand pre-deductible coverage of chronic care

On Monday (February 4), Reps. Vern Buchanan (R-FL) and Jimmy Panetta (D-CA) announced that they have re-introduced legislation to allow employers to offer pre-deductible coverage of chronic disease treatments for those with high-deductible health plans (HDHPs).

The bill would codify a 2019 policy that allows employers offering HDHPs to cover certain chronic disease treatments before the deductible. This commonsense bill gives employers more **flexibility in covering essential chronic disease treatments** -- including beta-blockers for heart failure, blood pressure monitors for hypertension, glucometers for diabetes, and inhalers for asthma -- while **easing the financial burden on employees** working to manage their health. Under the bill, HDHPs could cover up to 14 critical chronic care services pre-deductible and it includes the ability to update this list over time to ensure continued access to evolving treatments.

"The Alliance to Fight for Health Care appreciates the bipartisan work of Representatives Buchanan and Panetta in introducing the Chronic Disease Flexible Coverage Act," said **Katy** Johnson, president of the American Benefits Council.
